**The Salvation Army of Metro Detroit's Bed & Bread Program Receives \$50,000 Donation from Schostak Brothers & Company**

*The nonprofit serves more than 1.3 million meals to metro Detroit residents each year*

**SOUTHFIELD, Mich., (Sept. 20, 2022)** – [The Salvation Army of Metro Detroit](#) recently received a \$50,000 donation from Schostak Brothers & Co. The donation from the Michigan-based real estate company will help support the nonprofit's Bed & Bread Program which supplies the metro Detroit area with food and shelter every day of the year.

The Salvation Army's Bed & Bread trucks make 57 delivery stops throughout the city every day. In addition to serving meals, Bed & Bread trucks supply Detroiters with coats, blankets, gloves and other personal items. The program also provides nearly 200 nights of shelter daily, which translates to more than 72,000 nights of shelter annually.

"Bed & Bread meals are often the only thing people get to eat in a day," said Lt. Col. John Turner, divisional commander and regional CEO for The Salvation Army Great Lakes Division. "The Schostak Brothers' gift will allow our organization to continue meeting this dire need for the people of Detroit."

In June 2022, Schostak Brothers & Company announced they will mark their 100th anniversary with a community giving campaign to distribute \$1 million across impactful Detroit-based nonprofit organizations. Selected from a range of nonprofit sectors including neighborhoods, workforce development, education, health and entrepreneurship, the goal of the initiative was to select organizations based on their work in Detroit, the city where the company was founded a century ago.

The gift recipients have been chosen through an extensive selection process involving Schostak employees, with the intent to aid the charity's efforts while shining a light to reach other potential donors.
