The Facts

How often does workplace violence occur?

- According to the U.S. Department of Labor murder was the second leading cause of death in the workplace in 1996, accounting for 15% of all workplace deaths.
- ➤ 1 million individuals became victims of violent crime while working.
- ➤ Work place violence is the #1 cause of death for females, and #2 cause of death for males.

An active shooter is an individual killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and populated area.

Texas Tower incident August 1, 1966
Austin, TX on a college campus
15 dead, 31 wounded


The Active Shooter

- > Situations are unpredictable and,
- > Evolve quickly
- > The immediate deployment of law enforcement is required
- > Active shooters usually will continue to move throughout building until stopped by law enforcement, suicide, or other



Active Shooters in the US, 2002 - 2012




Incident Location

- > The mind set of survival is "no one is coming to rescue me...my life is in my hands."



The Basics

All security situations consist of (3) components

- > Awareness
- > Avoidance
- > Resolution



Awareness Components; Begins with <u>Awareness of the problem</u>

AWARNESS is the Foundation

- > Self: Capability and capacity assessment
- Environment: Physical lay out, ect.
- > Enemy
- > Intuition: "The Gut Knows!"

The Gut Knows



Avoidance

- > Physical displacement
- > Inaccessibility
- > Psychological manipulation

Resolution

- > Seek Legal intervention
- > Solution or compromise
- > Implement personal threat response

Types of Active Shooters

A. Work-place related and school shooter

B. Criminal terrorist

C. Ideological terrorist

Work-related/school shooter

- Concerned about current and specific problems; ie., job termination, conflict with others, financial issues, divorce, ect
- The shooter believes that violence will solve the problem
- Target fixated; persons or company/school assets are specially targeted

Work-related/school shooter



Criminal Terrorist

- > Non-specific targets
- > Fixated on causing mass casualties
- > Some planning is involved
- > Extensive mental rehearsal in the actual killing event
- > Mental illness may be obvious

Criminal Terrorist



Ideological Terrorist

- > Man on a mission
- > Rebel with a cause
- ➤ Believes that their actions will make a difference
- > Looking for the most bang for the buck!

Personal Response to an Active Shooter

- > Get Out
- > Hide Out
- > Take Action

Active Shooter Response



Effective Emergency Action Plan

- >Preferred method for reporting fires and other emergencies.
- >An evacuation policy and procedure.
- Emergency escape procedures and route assignments (i.e., floor plans, safe areas).
- >Contact information for—and responsibilities of—individuals to be contacted under the Emergency Action Plan.

Effective Emergency Action Plan

- ➤ Information concerning local area hospitals (i.e., name, telephone number, and distance from your location).
- > An emergency notification system to alert various parties of an emergency
- > Designated reunification site

Action Plan must include Training

The most effective way to train your employees to respond to an active shooter situation is to conduct mock active shooter training exercises
